- 1. **Opening Prayer-** Annamaria Falzarano
- 2. Approval of previous Minutes and current Agenda- Fr. John
 - a. Approved
 - b. Finance Council Last meet Mar 3rd, next meeting April 7th
 - i. 2024-25 CMA Campaign
 - 1. 116% of goal (\$102,000). Parishioners have until May 31 to fulfill pledges
 - ii. **Surplus for Sunday Plate-** information included in the bulletin; will be updated quarterly.
 - iii. Capital Projects
 - <u>HVAC Issues-</u> repairs completed and replaced zones values in the BMC to address heating issues throughout the building (including the Gym). Recent issues wit Church heat- fan belt broke (replaced), looking at supply fan motor for issues.
 - 2. <u>Audio Issues in the Church</u>- Speakers on base of alter to improve sound (and let the people in the sanctuary hear better)- before hearing loop decision. Looking to get additional feedback from parishioners with a survey in the bulletin for a few more weeks (didn't get as much feedback as expected). Looking at 2 options for Hearing Loop to cover from the front to back in the 4 central sections of the Church (will be discussed at the next meeting)

c. <u>Faith Formation/ Youth Ministry Update</u>

- i. Faith Formation Programs
 - 1. Sacramental Prep
 - a. First Eucharist prep continues- will take place May 10th at 11am
 - b. Confirmation prep- going well- will take place on May 14th at Sacred Heart Cathedral (with Holy Cross, Our Mother of Sorrows, St. Lawrence, St Mark's and St John's Greece)
 - c. First Penance- will take place at St. Charles in the fall of 2025

- 2. <u>Home Study and Summer Camp</u>
 - a. Home Study is going well, 2025 Summer Camp registrations (July 7-18th) are being accepted and have been announced in the bulletin
